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After the great success of the exhibition *Mothers, Daughters, Sisters* this summer at the Rencontres d'Arles and the publication of the eponymous book by Les éditions Textuel, it's now with *Family Likeness*, that Tom Wood's work is honoured in this new exhibition at Sit Down gallery.

To the triangle of mothers, daughters, sisters is added that of father, son and in particular brothers. Some vernacular photos of the filial relation belonging to the personal collection of Tom Wood punctuate the hanging.

From the early seventies to the present day, Tom Wood has been photographing untiringly generations of Liverpool's citizens in the street, the bus, at work and at play.

Known as the "Photie Man" by Liverpudlians, Tom Wood transcends photographic practice, wishing to know and to connect with people; there emerges a true complicity with the photographer, a clear connection in their confident looks oriented toward the camera lens.

The philosopher Wittgenstein spoke of the understanding which consists of 'seeing connections'. "Just as we see a face differently when you look at it, first as an expression of happiness then as an expression of pride". He once admonished a friend, "you don't take enough notice of peoples faces... it is a fault you ought to correct"!

A real tribute to women, men, families and to human nature, Tom Wood demonstrates again and again, a truly human look on the human.

"So you look at these pictures slowly because he (and they) made them slowly. And you begin to see not just the family resemblances [...] You begin to see the unpredictable conflagration of the Real Thing that illuminates what is real in ourselves. And that is exactly what Wood has worked so hard, with feet and brain and eye, for you to see".

BIOGRAPHY

For 45 years, Irish born Tom Wood (b. 1951) has photographed almost every day. Trained as a painter at Leicester Polytechnic from 1973-1976, he made his first exploration of lens-based media was through extensive viewing of experimental films.

Some of Tom Wood's works joined the collections of MOMA and ICP in New York, of the Art Institute of Chicago, and of Victoria & Albert Museum at London. He has also received the "Dialogue Awards of Humanity" at the "Rencontres d'Arles" in 2002.

Tom Wood was the subject of two documentary films: BBC4's documentary What Do Artists Do All Day? And Five Days with Tom by the French director Emmanuel Bonn.

His work is also included in the book by Mark Durden, Photography Today: A History of Contemporary Photography (2014), and in the revised edition of Bystander: the History of Street Photography (2017). His book All Zones Off Peak has been featured in The Photo Book: A History vol.2 (2006) by Martin Parr and Gerry Badger.

In 2019, his works on women, *Mother, daughters and sisters* have been honored at the "Rencontres d'Arles" festival.

SIT DOWN GALLERY

Established in *Le Marais* area in Paris, close to the Picasso Museum, SIT DOWN gallery was founded by Françoise Bornstein in 2005 and is a member of the French "Comité Professionnel des Galeries d'Art".

Since 2013 the gallery has been entirely devoted to photography, and its programming consists primarily of documentary and fine-art photography. The gallery aims to showcase young emerging photographers and support renowned international photographers such as Tom Wood, Yan Morvan, and Sacha Van Dorssen.

In addition to organizing personal exhibitions, Françoise Bornstein invites curators to participate in exhibition projects during special events or art fairs.

Through artists representation, SIT DOWN gallery has established itself as a major figure in documentary photography and opens its doors to the creativity of young photographers who bring new vision to this medium.

Françoise Bornstein is a also a nominee for the Niépce prize and an expert at the Photo Folio Review of "Les Rencontres d'Arles".
